Don't let your guard down during the holidays! More than 155,000 fires occur in the US during the holidays. Whether it's Christmas, Thanksgiving, New Year's or Halloween, holidays are the time to be extra cautious about fire safety.

Follow the tips below to ensure everyone has a safe and happy holiday season.

More than 21,000 house fires start as chimney fires.

- Never leave a fire unattended.
- Never allow children to play near a fireplace.
- Utilize safety screens to reduce the risk of burns.



Never hang stockings over a lit fireplace. Make sure hearth decorations, like tinsel or ribbons are not too close to the fire.





31% of kitchen fires are caused by unattended equipment.

- Never wear loose clothing or sleeves that dangle while cooking.
- Make sure kids and pets stay at least three feet away from the stove.
- Keep anything that can catch fire away from your stove.



- Frequently water your tree. Dry needles lead to fire.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat



Avoid using kitchen appliances if you're sleepy or consumed alcohol.



CANDLES More than 1/3 of home decoration fires are started by candles.

- Never leave burning candles unattended. Make sure they are completely out before leaving the room.
- Keep candles at least one foot away from anything that can burn.

- Make sure the tree does not block an exit.
- Replace any string lights that have worn or broken cords.



More than 1 in 5 Christmas tree fires were caused by a heat source too close to the tree.

FIREWOODERS Fireworks start over 19,000 fires and send 9,000 people to the hospital each year.

- Rever use fireworks when impaired by drugs or alcohol.
- Always have an adult supervise fireworks activities.
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person.

Keep a bucket of water or garden hose handy in case of fire and to douse fireworks before discarding.
