





Check Off the List to be Fire Safe!

 Get a grown-up to help you complete the checklist at your home.

1. Does a grown-up stay in the kitchen when food is being cooked on the stove?		
2. Are portable space heaters turned off when everyone goes to bed or leaves the home?		
3. Are smoke alarms installed on every level of your home?		
4. Does everyone know what the smoke alarm sounds like?		
5. Are electrical cords and plugs in good condition (not cracked or frayed)?		
6. Has everyone in your home practiced a home fire drill in the last six months?		
7. Are all the exits in your home free from furniture, toys or other clutter?		
8. Do grown-ups remember to turn pot handles inward on the stove when cooking?		
9. Do you have a Safe Meeting Place outside the home where everyone will meet in case of a fire?		
10. Have you checked to make sure that electrical outlets are not overloaded?		
11. Does everyone know how to Stop, Drop & Roll if their clothes catch fire?		
12. Does everyone know how to call the fire department in case of an emergency?		

If you answered "No" to any of these questions you could have a possible fire hazard.
